Fast Art Slow Fashion Competition

Are you interested in sustainable lifestyle, fast fashion and slow fashion? Would you like to participate in an exciting national and international competition, where you can get to know young people from other European countries? Do you like creative challenges? If you answer yes to any of these questions, join us, and take part in the Fast Art Slow Fashion Competition.

What is the Fast Art Slow Fashion (FASF) competition?

The main aim of Fast Art Slow Fashion project is to promote the sustainable lifestyles in the field of fashion. The FASF team consists of four partners from three countries: Association for Creative Education and MASZK from Hungary, aiforia from Germany and IDEC from Greece. The FASF team created many interesting videos, podcasts, animations related to fast fashion that are freely available [on our website](#). Now, this is your time to join us and participate in an exciting and **creative competition alone or together with your friends**.


The **competition is completely online**, this means that you need to upload your solutions in digital format to a dedicated platform, and the jury evaluates them after the deadlines of each round expired. There will be three national rounds, and you can join us in Hungary, Greece, or Germany in the local national languages or in English. There will be **an international final round in English**. For each round, you alone or your team with 2-4 members need to solve **creative tasks** related to fast fashion and submit your solutions via the given platform. Respective task sheets and guidance will be the baseline for all teams.

So that we ensure objective evaluation, the national rounds will contain the same tasks and timing in each country. In the 1st and 2nd round, the teams need to submit their digital solutions via a given platform, and in the 3rd round, you have to create a video that should be uploaded to a given platform. The exact tasks, requirements and submission information will be detailed in the **task sheets**.

Why shall I participate in this competition?

If you participate in this competition, you will solve some complex and creative tasks alone or with your friends, so these tasks will improve your problem-solving skills, creativity and capability to work in a group. You can expand your network and can get to know young foreign people. You will deepen your knowledge on fast and slow fashion. Moreover, you can get a **Youth Pass**, if you complete all rounds. At the end of the national rounds, all participants will be awarded a certificate of **Ambassadors of Slow Fashion**.



The best team(s) will receive a package of gifts.

Who can apply for the competition?

You can apply for the competition **alone** or in teams with **minimum 2, maximum 4 members** from all over the world. At least one team member needs to be between 16 and 25 years old at the time of application. You need to speak any of the **national languages of the participant countries** (German, Greek, Hungarian) **or English**.

How can I apply to the FASF competition?

The application means **automatic participation** in the competition. Please remember that at least one person of the team needs to belong to the age group of 16-25 at the time of application.

The **application period is between 14 - 20 February 2022**. The first task will arrive to you on 1 March 2022.

The language of the national rounds will be in the national languages of the participating countries or English (it depends on the applicant teams). The language of the international round will be English.

Where can I find the descriptions of the tasks?

The teams will get to know that tasks (with evaluation criteria) and the submission deadlines in various channels:

- the task sheets will be published in the [Fast Art Slow Fashion Facebook page](#),
- **dedicated events** on Facebook (in English and national languages),

- the team leader will get it via **email**, and
- uploaded on **FASF website**.

Remember joining the **FASF Facebook Group**, as during the competition rounds, you will receive tips.

When shall I have to solve the tasks?

The **three national rounds and the final, international round** have the following periods for solving the tasks:



The teams need to participate in all 3 national rounds and will know the points they received from the jury only after the 3rd national round. The **final results of the national rounds** will be published by 30 June 2022.

Only the solutions submitted by the given deadlines can be accepted!

Who goes to the international round?

National and international juries will evaluate the submitted contributions by the help of a scoreboard. Those maximum 3 teams in a country that have the highest points are nominated to the international round – which will be online too.


