We would like to introduce our latest results and findings that we accomplished in the past months.

After an extensive secondary research on the fast fashion industry and its effects on the environment, society and the economy, we have drawn some conclusions. We find it inevitable to include the youth in this global problem, as they might be the key to understand and do something against the harmful effects of fast fashion.

Therefore, we launched a questionnaire in our partners' countries to ask pupils about what they think, what is the best tool for them to learn from in the most effective way. We took students answers into account, and thereby started assembling tools for them to learn interactively from.

Using creative educational methods, we believe that the interest of the new generation could be grasped and they would be willing to learn about this issue, and eventually do something against it.

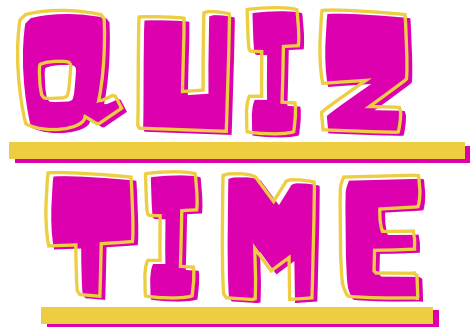

Online tools

How do online quizzes help?

Podcasts

Secondly, youngsters chose podcast as an important tool in their learning activities. Currently, we are creating a series of podcast on the topic of fast fashion. Moreover, we are not only interviewing local professionals, but we are reaching out to students to tell us (and other students) about their own experience about fast fashion. This way, we can take the topic much closer to them.

Podcasts are created in national languages and in English as well. In order to reach a wider audience, national language podcasts and their essences are summarized in a document in English.

Interactive video and Infographics

Last but not least, students also voted for other tools, such as the interactive video and infographics. Our team is working closely together with young students to determine, what kind of interaction would be suitable in a video and how it can be carried out technology-wise. Currently, video series topics are being discussed so that the videos will be finished and put live on YouTube.

Additionally, local youngsters are also involved in creating infographics to make the facts and figures easily readable and understandable for the younger generation, who might not be capable of reading huge junks of texts, but instead, they would go through a page of infographics.
